Subject: Emergency Broadband Benefit (EBB) Communication

In further support of families during these challenging times, I would like to share the news that the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has launched a temporary program to help households afford internet service during the COVID-19 pandemic. Eligible households can receive:

- Up to \$50 per month discount on broadband internet service
- Up to \$75 per month for qualifying households on qualifying Tribal lands
- A one-time discount of up to \$100 towards the purchase of a tablet, laptop or desktop computer (if the eligible purchaser contributes more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase through a participating broadband provider).

Households may qualify for the Emergency Broadband Program when any member of the household (related or not) meets the following criteria (click <u>here</u> for eligibility details):

- Has income below \$99,000 for single filers or \$198,000 for joint filers, or has income at or below 135% of the <u>Federal Poverty Guidelines</u>
- Participates in SNAP, Medicaid or Lifeline
- Approved to receive benefits under the free and reduced-price school lunch program
- Received a federal Pell Grant during the current award year

- Experienced a substantial loss of income through job loss or furlough since February 29, 2020
- Meets the eligibility criteria for a participating provider's existing low income or COVID-19 program
